Identification of adult mosquitoes  
not an easy task because useful  
aracters for separation are few,  
and are usually lost in badly rubbed  
ecimens. Fortunately the larvae are

more easily identified. Dr. Rempel's  
key to the larvae will thus be use-  
ful to anyone with limited exper-  
ience in taxonomy, while the keys  
to the adults will most benefit those  
with a wider experience in taxono-  
mic work. —Harvey Beck, Saskatoon.
