on of Saskatchewan; to mosquito aptation to survival; and to relation of mosquitoes to Western Equine acephalomyelitis.

Identification of adult mosquitoes not an easy task because useful aracters for separation are few, and are usually lost in badly rubbed ecimens. Fortunately the larvae are

more easily identified. Dr. Rempel's key to the larvae will thus be useful to anyone with limited experience in taxonomy, while the keys to the adults will most benefit those with a wider experience in taxonomic work. —Harvey Beck, Saskatoon.
