## Turtle Stones By A. J. Hruska, Gerald

Scattered over our province are interesting rocks which people somecall "Turtle Stones." times The marking on these rocks do sometimes, as in the one illustrated, resemble the markings of a turtle carapace, but these rocks are not parts of a fossil turtle. The Turtle Stone has been formed by the cracking of some early deposit. The polygonal cracks are later filled in by another material, perhaps a calcite. These two rock materials are later exposed and in this case the rock has been waterworn, for its edges are rounded and smooth.
