The Large Fringe-cup, which may have stems two feet tall, grows in moist thickets in western North America from Oregon to Alaska. This interesting plant of the Saxifragaceae, with its spreading, dissected petals, is a relative of our small Bishop's Cap, *Mitella nuda* L., which may be found at Candle Lake, the location of the Summer Meeting, 1965.
