

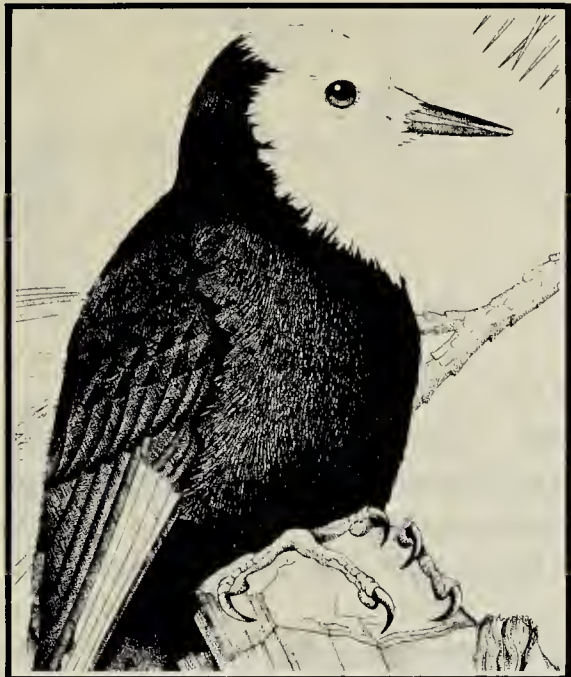

The Okanagan Valley is famous in Canada and further afield for its varied bird fauna, especially the rich mixture of northern and southern species. Seasonal status, habitat preferences, migration patterns, breeding biology, and feeding behaviour are discussed for the 307 species (194 breeding) recorded. The authors examined over 126,000 records from both historical and modern sources. Introductory chapters outline the Okanagan as an environment for birds, stressing the historical changes that have affected them. Included are dozens of tables and graphs, black-and-white photographs of birds and their habitats, and sketches by the well-known Okanagan ornithologist and bird artist, Allan Brooks.
